DID YOU KNOW?

For the November 10, 2005 groundbreaking, Bill and Margot Winspear's gift of \$42M was the largest of its kind in Dallas history at the time.

The Moody Foundation Chandelier is composed of 318 acrylic L.E.D. light rods with 4 LEDs in each rod and are 6 feet long. They can be arranged into many configurations by the 44 motors that raise and lower the rods.

The colorful pattern on the Kuitca Curtain was designed by Argentine artist Guillermo Kuitca commissioned and is a configuration of the Winspear seating chart.

The Winspear Opera House backstage area is big enough to park a Boeing 737 plane.

The Dee and Charles Wyly Theatre is covered with 466 aluminum tubes in 6 different sizes. Each tube is suspended from the top of the 10-story building, and attached individually, draping down the sides like a giant metal curtain.

The furthest seat from the stage is 119 feet from the front of the stage which is closer than the front of balcony at Fair Park.

Developed in collaboration with community groups and leaders, ArtsBridge - Powered By Toyota provides West Dallas residents with cultural experiences both within their community and on the Center's campus.

Young Women's Leadership Conference is an annual event that connects high school women with accomplished women artists and leaders for workshops and discussions about a wide range of leadership and life skills developed through the study of performing arts.

Open Stages brings students from Dallas Area schools to experience high quality performances of Broadway and dance, as well as, interactive workshops with professional teaching artists.

Backstage Spotlight provides hands-on training for high school theatre technicians inside the Center's premier performance venues.

With the goal of creating sustainable musical theatre programs in public elementary schools, **Disney Musicals in School** provides students with the opportunity to spend a semester learning a Disney musical, then perform for family and friends in the big Student Share production in the Winspear Opera House.
